LUNCH

Café du coin

Florent Ciccoli's airy neighbourhood cafe is known for its golden-crusted pizzettas with toppings ranging from asparagus and gorgonzola to Corsican sausage and onion. 9 Rue Camille Desmoulins, 75011 +33 1 48 04 82 46

Le Mermoz

Tawlet

Ober Mamma

Chez Georges

Le Petit Célestin

Sardinian chef Simone Tondo's immaculate osteria serves slow-cooked Italian comfort classics such as *vitello tonnato* alongside an impressive array of natural wine. Don't leave without trying the tiramisu. *racinesparis.com*

This popular Algerian brasserie in the heart of Le Marais doesn't take reservations but its sumptuous tagines and melt-in-the-mouth stewed lamb make it very much worth the wait for a table.

La Cave à Michel

In the evening this petite wine shop transforms into a lively standing-room-only neighbourhood watering hole. There's also an excellent small plate menu if you need to line your stomach.

Harry's Bar

An icon of Parisian nightlife for more than a century, this historic bar was a favourite of Jean-Paul Sartre and is supposedly the birthplace of the bloody mary. harrysbar.fr

For a taste of 1930s jazz age Paris, head to this sultry Montparnasse institution for its low-key speakeasy feel and old-school cocktail menu. Think moody lighting and cosy corners.

Bar Hemingway

Culture

Palais de Tokyo

Just a stroll from the Eiffel Tower, this building is a futuristic exhibition space for contemporary international art. Across four floors, experimental and thought-provoking shows create an interactive wonder factory. 13 Avenue du Président Wilson, 75116 palaisdetokyo.com

Jeu de Paume

Located within the Jardin des Tuileries, this gallery hosts exhibitions of photography and video art from an international array of artists that has included the likes of Florence Henri and Ai Weiwei.

Hôtel Biron was Rodin's home and studio. Today it houses works by the sculptor as well as pieces from his own collection of antiquities. In the garden you'll find his famous "The Thinker" statue.
